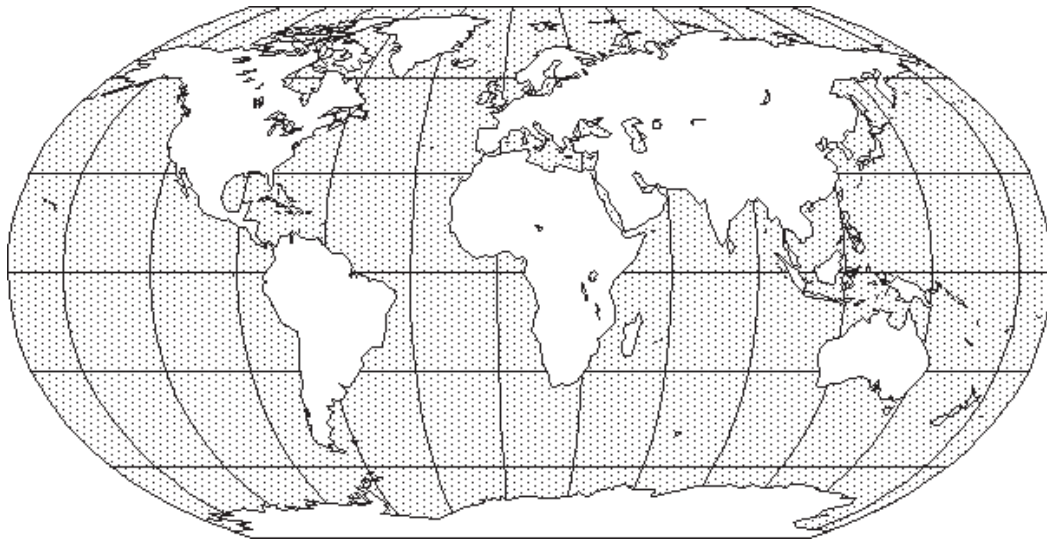

RETURN REGISTRATION FORM BY JUNE 1. A *minimum deposit of \$10* is required with each registration form. For those who prepay, you can avoid registration delays and go directly to your dorm. We would like to highly encourage prepayment so that less time is spent standing in lines.

HOUSING — MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HIGH SCHOOL:

Those entering grades 9-12 (9th graders must be at least 14 years of age) will be staying in a separate dorm. Each student needs to include the name, address, and phone number of a parent or adult over age 21 who **WILL BE ATTENDING** the conference and will be responsible for the high schooler. Grades 6-8 will be under supervision of counselors during the day but housed with parents or guardian.

Charges include meals, room, linens, towels, insurance, and registration.

(Meals begin Saturday evening, July 24, and end Thursday evening, July 29.)

Single occupancy room with shared bath available on limited basis. Charge is \$295 full-time or \$60 daily. Please indicate this choice on the registration form.

Limited air conditioned on-campus housing is available in the new Prince Conference Center at an additional cost. Also, air-conditioned rooms in local motels with reasonable off-campus rates will be available. Staying Off-Campus: There will be registration and charges at the following daily rates: **High school through adults**, \$35 with meals or \$15 without meals; **Middle school and below**, \$20 with meals or \$10 without meals.

Room Keys: Will be issued to each conferee, high school and over. A lost key will result in a \$5 charge (college liability makes this a necessity).

Disabilities: The Board to Address Disability Concerns would like to provide help for persons with disabilities. If you have a need—such as help carrying trays, finding meeting places, or child care for a handicapped child for an afternoon—please indicate on the back of the registration form. Please also indicate any of the following: (1) If you are able-bodied and would like to **HELP** provide such services; (2) If you need a 1st-floor room and/or wheelchair-accessible room; (3) If you need or can provide signing for the hearing-impaired.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

Purpose: The RP International Conference is a God-given opportunity for the strengthening of this portion of the Body of Christ. Its purpose is fourfold: 1) to foster and develop *spiritual growth*; 2) to *worship* God corporately; 3) to promote the *mission and ministry* of the church; and 4) to encourage and enrich Christian *fellowship*.

Attitude: We ask you to come to the conference with a threefold attitude: an attitude of *reverence* for God; an attitude of *enthusiasm* for what will take place; and an attitude of *service* toward others to help make their conference experience a good one.

Bring the Following: Bible; Psalm book (Book of Psalms for Singing and Psalm Settings); *Materials for taking notes*; a **Fan** for your room (there is no a/c in the dorms); *Appropriate clothing*, including items for recreation (for example, a swim suit). Bed linens, towels, and pillows will be provided by the college.

Anyone high school age or younger must be accompanied by a parent or adult who will serve as a guardian and chaperone for the young person. Middle school and younger (age 13 and below) must stay in the dorm with parent/guardian. If there are any disciplinary problems with the young person, the parent/guardian will be expected to help in solving them and, if necessary, may be required to take the young person home early.
